Friends' School, as one of nine Quaker Schools in England and Ireland, has a long tradition in Lisburn, founded in 1774 by a Quaker linen merchant, John Hancock. Today, we are a co-educational, interdenominational voluntary grammar school of some 990 pupils and we seek to provide an environment in which pupils, staff and parents are committed to the idea of excellence within a caring and supportive community. The Quaker belief in care for the individual and in the development of each person's potential remains central to our ethos and helps us to cater successfully for the different traditions within the community of Lisburn.



SIXTH FORM

Most pupils in Year 13 study 4 subjects to AS level. AS examinations are taken at the end of Year 13. Most pupils continue with 3 subjects to A2 level, thus gaining the full Advanced Level qualification at the end of Year 14.

Some pupils continue with 4 subjects at A2 and some take up a further AS subject in Year 14. Some A Level courses are taught in collaboration with The Wallace High School, and the South Eastern Regional College. Pupils are also prepared for UCAS, Oxbridge and National Admissions Tests for Law and Medical Science.
